Part 1: What does participation involve?

1.1 Introduction

You are invited to take part in this research project because you have been a user of the Carer Gateway service.

This Participant Information Sheet / Consent Form tells you about the research project. It explains the processes involved with taking part. Knowing what is involved will help you decide if you want to take part in the research. Please read this information carefully.

Participation in this research is voluntary. If you don't wish to take part, you don't have to.

If you decide you want to take part in the research project, you will be asked to sign the consent section. By signing it you are telling us that you:

- understand what you have read
- consent to take part in the research project
- consent to be involved in the research described
- consent to the use of personal and health information as described.

You will be given a copy of this Participant Information and Consent Form to keep.

1.2 What is the purpose of this research?

Urbis is an independent research company that has been engaged by the Department of Social Services (the Department) to conduct a research study that will help the Department understand how well the Carer Gateway service is being implemented. The Department is the organisation which administers the Carer Gateway program on behalf of the Australian Government. Community-based carer support services across Australia are funded by the Department to deliver Carer Gateway support services, which are accessed through a single phone number and website gateway.

The project is looking to understand how well the Carer Gateway service has been delivered to service users like yourself.

The project is looking to understand:

- the experiences and perspectives of people who have used the Carer Gateway service
- what would help to improve the delivery of the Carer Gateway service.

The research findings will be used to inform decision-making about how the current Carer Gateway service can provide better support to current and future Carer Gateway service users, including informing future service design to improve supports for carers.

1.3 What does participation in this research involve?

Your participation in this research will involve taking part in an online focus group, or an online or telephone interview via a software application such as Skype or Zoom with one of the members of the Urbis research team. It is your preference as to whether you would rather engage in a focus group or a one-on-one interview.

Focus groups will last up to 60 minutes, while interviews will last up to 30 minutes. Both are designed to be fairly casual and conversational, rather than too formal, and no prior preparation is needed before the interview.

We will ask you about:

- your experiences so far as a user of the Carer Gateway service

Any information you share in this research project will **not** impact in any way on your eligibility for Government services and/or payments e.g. Carer Payment and/or Carer Allowance.

1.5 What are the possible benefits of this study?

A potential benefit of the study is that receiving feedback on the current service could provide the Department with opportunities to enhance delivery of the current service to provide better support to current and future Carer Gateway service users.

1.6 What are the possible risks and disadvantages of taking part?

There are some risks from participating in this research. Depending on your experience, it is possible you may feel some discomfort or distress answering questions about using the Carer Gateway service. If you do not wish to answer a question during the interview, you can let the researcher know, or they can stop the interview immediately. This will be explained to you at the commencement of the interview.
